## Conference Reports Show Fast World-wide Growth

*New Truth Revealed--Doctrines Clarified*

**Fifty-four Ministers and Elders from around the world convened for FOURTEEN sessions of the most important meetings on the face of the earth! This Ministerial Conference proved to be the most dynamic and helpful in the history of God's Church to this date!**

**SEVEN ordinations at Sabbath services during the conference provided a unique occasion—the offices of Local Elder, Preaching Elder, Pastor and Evangelist all being represented. This service brought to sixty-seven the total of ordained men; Mr. H. W. Armstrong; ten Evangelists; six Pastors; twenty-nine Preaching Elders; twenty-one Local Elders. Nearly thirteen thousand of God's people attend fifty-nine churches around the world—not including the six congregations in the Philippine Islands!**

### Foreign Reports

Reports concerning the foreign work revealed a PLAIN TRUTH mailing list of **six-thousand** in the Philippines—plans for immediate broadcasting of **The World Tomorrow** in English in Japan—**twenty-nine** newly-baptized members of God's Church in South Africa, and plans for an office and churches to be established there—**three-thousand** on the growing French mailing list, soon to receive the PLAIN TRUTH in their own language—a burgeoning German Work with **five thousand** presently receiving DIE RHINE WARHEIT—the Spanish Work with nearly **two thousand** on the mailing list A fast-growing Italian Work, and embryonic beginnings of Russian, Swedish, Portuguese and Japanese Departments.

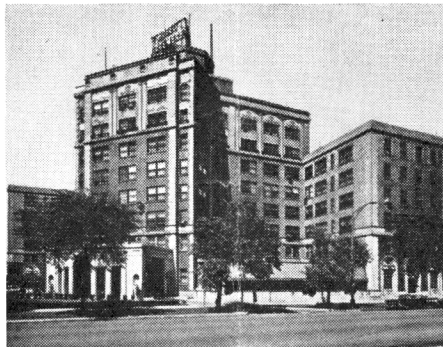

It was truly a privilege and a pleasure to have Mr. Allen Manteufel here in Indianapolis for two Sabbaths.

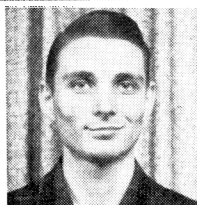

wisdom, he was led to Mr. Armstrong and God's true Church in Pasadena California.

In 1957 Mr. Jackson was ordained a Deacon in San Diego Church. Living in San Diego, California, near the Headquarters Church, he was privileged to receive personal correction and instructions direct from the top ranking ministers in God's Church. His growth and development continued until in November of 1959 he was ordained Local Elder, and immediately sent to Chicago to work with God's people of his race.

There were 65 Negroes in the Chicago Church at that time. In February of 1960 your author was ordained Deacon and assisted Mr. Jackson in visiting the widows and new members. The growth had increased by November of 1961 to the place where more help was needed. Mr. Clarence Bass, with his wife, was sent to Chicago to become the full time assistant to Mr. Jackson. They came to Chicago from Waco, Texas.

Mr. Edwin Marrs was ordained as a Deacon in January of 1961 and in July of 1962 was sent with his family, to Meridian, Mississippi.

Noticing the continuous growth among

the Negro brethren, God's ministers saw the necessity of sending Mr. Bass back to College for one semester to obtain his Master's degree in English.

In June of 1961 God divided the over crowded Church in Chicago and one half of the membership began attending a new Church in LaGrange. Again the Church in Chicago grew and became overly crowded! On the Sabbath of February 2, a new segment was started by dividing the Chicago Church. This brought about something different: the first all Negro Church.

Mr. Dean Blackwell is the pastor. Mr. Jackson is the associate pastor. The wisdom and love of God can be easily seen, because qualified men can receive active training and experience as leaders among their people. In addition we have a Bible study, Spokesman Club and a special class of 12 selected men to receive special training and instruction from Mr. Blackwell every Sunday morning.

We are grateful for the opportunity to serve and welcome the challenge to prepare ourselves (with God's help) for the work that lies ahead.

Yes—God is fulfilling His word!! The Negro Gentiles are coming into Christ by His Holy Spirit (Jer. 13:19).
