BLESSINGS FLOW FOR OUR "ON TRACK" PERFORMANCE

We moved to put ourselves "back on God's track." Now God is moving to shower blessings on His Work. IN EVERY WAY THE WORK IS LUNGING AHEAD and God is increasing membership and income.

I have said before that when our lives and performance are pleasing to God, He bestows on us blessings. He is adding conversions. He is prospering us so that financial income is once again increasing as it was during the first 35 years of this Work.

At services on the Unleavened Bread holy days, attendance worldwide averaged around 9% increase over the year before. Holy day offerings were sensational. First and last holy day offerings increased as follows: In Australia, 57% and 72.4%; in New Zealand, 42.5% and 57.8%; in Canada, 35% and 33.7%; in Germany, 78.1% and 31.9% (the only country with loss in attendance--1.2%); United Kingdom, 26% and 20%; United States, 26.6% and 24.9%; South Africa, 31.5% and 38.7%. Even considering inflation, these are splendid increases.

In March, 100,000 new subscribers were added to The PLAIN TRUTH subscription list--not counting newsstand distribution. This is United States only. Mail subscribers, 1,090,384; newsstand circulation, 740,000. In the first 3 months of this year we added 206,000 new subscribers. An estimated 130,000 more were added in April. The present trend indicates close to 1,000,000 new subscribers will be added during the current year. Newsstand response--those adding new mail subscriptions--has doubled the past few months. Requests for magazines and equipment are twice what was projected. Newsstand response is 2.35% and growing.

Introductory PLAIN TRUTHS are being sent out three times the usual rate. Normal 6-7 months supply exhausted in 2 months. Cardholder Program has added 24,145 new subscribers, and on the Waiting Room Program 53,000 doctors' and dentists' waiting room copies have been added so far this year. Forty thousand new subscribers have been added in 3 months by blow-in subscription cards.

The renewal rate for regular subscribers is 54%.

In all these 48 years of the Work perhaps no other part of the Work has accomplished as much as The PLAIN TRUTH. During these 48 years no other facet of the Work has done as much to spread the Gospel message as The PLAIN TRUTH.

Stop a moment and compare this Work with other professing "gospel" works in the world. Billy Graham conducts crusades. They are usually

planned and started a year in advance. Six months in advance local churches, who will join in general with the Baptist doctrines, begin organizing the crusade. At what they find to be the proper time in advance of the crusade, committees start work on all church members, as well as the general public, to work up interest and attendance at the crusade. Of course, many, probably most, of those attending a crusade are church members.

Dr. Graham's evangelistic association presents limited literature to those who "come forward." They also send this to those responding from televised broadcasts of the crusades. But they publish no magazine comparable to The PLAIN TRUTH. The crusades are followed up by local denominational churches by inviting church attendance. Mr. Graham closes most of his crusade meetings and telecasts urging people to attend church next Sunday, but their association is not a church and they have no program for continually "feeding the flock," local ministerial contact, counseling and continual personal contact and fellowship.

Just about all radio and television religious programs are limited primarily to the broadcasts, begging the public for contributions, and a very limited (and usually ineffective) literature follow-up.

Up until about 1968 or 1970 we purchased more radio time--with a DAILY broadcast, on numerous major 50,000-watt stations all over the United States and Canada, besides other countries around the world. We were the BIGGEST PROGRAM ON THE AIR of a religious nature. This was followed up by The PLAIN TRUTH reaching many MILLIONS, and with an Ambassador College-educated ministry--besides many booklets and even books--all sent FREE.

There is not, and never has been, any program like this program of the living GOD for spreading Christ's message of the Gospel of the KINGDOM OF GOD to the whole world.

No other leader of any religious movement--even though deceived into being Satan's movement--has had a program that would remotely compare in effectiveness with GOD'S program. No other leader has gone to as many countries, and to personally-invited meetings by kings, emperors, presidents and prime ministers, opening doors to reach their people.

I just wondered if you realized these facts. We should not just take them for granted. We should realize God has planned all this--guided it all--prepared His servant in a very special way even before conversion--for this great and mighty worldwide Work, proclaiming, alone by itself, the real TRUTH of God!

God's Church is positively UNIQUE, none is like it. Take, for example, our publications. There is no magazine like The PLAIN TRUTH, whether secular or religious. It has the interest of a leading national news magazine, but it views and explains world news and happenings from GOD'S point of view--sees events and their meaning as GOD does, looking down from heaven. No other church or magazine editorship has the KNOWLEDGE to do that.


No other church has a program remotely comparable to ours. In our publications, besides The PLAIN TRUTH, members receive semi-monthly, The WORLDWIDE NEWS, keeping them up-to-date on Church and Gospel-proclaiming happenings, besides so much personal news to keep us all close together in a

spiritual fellowship with God and with Christ. Then the new YOUTH 81 magazine for the youth of the Church--and a weekly PASTOR GENERAL'S REPORT. No church--Catholic, Methodist, Baptist or whatever, has a publication program such as God has given us. No church has weekly events, keeping up member interest, like God's Church. Take our Spokesman's Clubs, our Y.O.U. and Y.E.S. programs--our basketball and other activities--our annual Feast of Tabernacles and other feasts to hold us together, and keep us growing spiritually. THERE IS JUST NO CHURCH LIKE GOD'S CHURCH! I think we need to realize HOW DIFFERENT--and how much MORE INTERESTING, how much more spiritually stimulating and invigorating is GOD'S Church.

And our publications are a vital and basic part of the Church--its life, and its growth.

Now the way is opened for us to place The PLAIN TRUTH into hundreds and thousands of chain supermarkets--Safeway and others. I will describe this in a letter to members.

So much of this growth and spiritual development has come through our publications. Before my conversion, God trained me in the field of publications, and also in public speaking. I think I had not realized, myself, how vital this early training was in building God's Church and Work.



FROM MINISTERIAL SERVICES

Northern Ireland Brethren Request Prayers for Their Safety

To most of the world, turmoil in Northern Ireland over Bobby Sand's death is a hot news story, but to brethren there it could become an intense question of survival! If violence becomes widespread, nearly 300 members might be affected.

In the twelve years of troubles in Northern Ireland, brethren have escaped involvement. But now, with tensions running very high, one church member said he is fully expecting to see the day when a Protestant will come up and hand him a gun and say, "Are you with us or against us?" If not, the member expressed fears of being shot on the spot! Following is a report on the tense situation by one of our men in Radlett, England, dated May 5th:

My family and I had the opportunity of being with the local pastor and his family in Belfast for the last Holy Day services. Whilst in Northern Ireland we took the opportunity to drive through some of the more wrecked areas of the capital to see the results of the violence and destruction that have taken place on such a large scale. The graffiti, anti-British and pro-terrorist slogans are everywhere.

Time magazine and the media generally are full of the current Northern Irish situation. As the hunger-striker Bobby Sands has died, there has started a violent backlash. People are hoarding in food almost with a seige mentality. There have been displays of strength by both

sides on the street corners involving 2,500 men the other evening in West Belfast. Youngsters are stockpiling bricks, bottles, missiles, etc. in order to use them in the running street battles that are anticipated. I mention all of this because the Church members have specifically requested the prayers of their brethren for their safety during this tense time. In twelve years of troubles thus far they have virtually escaped any involvement. But with over 300 people attending the two churches in Belfast and Ballymena, we would remind you of this situation and ask you to continually remember them in your prayers to God. The British Army has many dozens of soldiers constantly on duty in both Belfast and Londonderry along with the regular Police force. The best they are doing is containing this boiling cauldron, but how close to real eruption is the question now.

As we here watch the reports on television and in the press, each side seems to become more and more entrenched. The hatred is very obvious and from the viewpoint of the members, only God's protection and the encouragement of their faith will see them through.

Continued Prayers Requested for Minister's Son

Wayne Chapman, son of Mr. and Mrs. Jim Chapman of the Reno Church, has come a long way since his three-story fall from a scaffold last winter. He is now out of the coma but is still having difficulty communicating--usually saying just a few words occasionally. Nevertheless, he is responding to those around him. Therapists at the rehabilitation center in San Francisco where he is now are trying to stimulate further progress, but their prognosis is that Wayne will never be completely normal due to brain damage. Barbara and Jim request your and the brethren's continued prayers for Wayne's complete healing, which they fully expect. The warmth and concern of so many, along with the calls and cards, has meant very much to them during this trial.

International News

German Office Report The highlight of the month, of course, was the spring feast. Passover evening, Passover day and the first day of Unleavened Bread were spent together by the brethren at four sites in the German-speaking area of Europe: Hankensbuttel in Northern Germany, the Rheinland town of Eltville, Switzerland's capital city Zurich, and Austria's famous tourist center, Salzburg. In addition to the Passover evening services, four additional services were held on Saturday and Sunday at each feast site. Opportunities for fellowship were rounded out beautifully by an

excellent feast dinner on the "Night to be Much Observed," as well as by a Church dance-social Sunday night at each site.

The brethren expressed enthusiastic appreciation for this wonderful chance to be together--appreciation which was reflected in a total feast offering more than 50% higher than last year's!

Transfer: Local Elder Thomas Root and his family are to be transferred to the Pasadena campus in July of this year. Mr. Root will teach German at the College, as well as serve as liason man and editorial representative for the Bonn Office. His former Church areas of Darmstadt and Stuttgart will be pastored from Bonn by Bonn office manager John Karlson.

Advertising: One million newspaper flyers advertising The PLAIN TRUTH (KLAR & WAHR) have been printed. 500,000 are planned for Germany, 250,000 for Switzerland and 250,000 for Austria.

On Tuesday, April 28th, the first 190,000 flyers appeared in the well-known national daily newspaper "Die Welt." In the first two days we've already received 1700 requests and expect about 3% or 5700 responses in all. We hope for more.

Another 110,000 flyers will be placed in the Swiss "Schweizer Beobachter" magazine on May 15th. On May 16th 80,000 flyers will appear in the Austrian newspaper "Die Presse," and on May 25th another 70,000 flyers will appear in the Austrian weekly magazine "Profil." We hope for an average 3% response, which means around 13,500 new subscribers will be added to our list this spring.

The mail income for April was up 20% over April of last year. The year-to-date total mail income is about +17.4%.

British Activities Space has now been booked in three of the top British newspapers to receive Mr. Armstrong's ads. The campaign was planned to begin on the fifth or sixth of May with a full-page message ad in the Daily Mail entitled "What's Wrong With Our Educational System?" The same ad will appear during subsequent weeks in The Times and Daily Telegraph--a combined circulation of over 3.6 million newspapers. By also using the ad Mr. Armstrong wrote on science and technology, and the one entitled "A Staggering Turn in World Events," the campaign should run for a total of nine weeks in the three newspapers mentioned.

Our advertising agent in London made a very interesting comment on the planned campaign: He felt that the impact we would have on the top echelon of the people in this country would be greater in two months than after five years of running the smaller coupon advertisements we have used in the past!

Although the advertisements are really designed to convey a message rather than generate a response, a coupon has been added to the bottom of each ad, with Mr. Armstrong's approval, and two telephone numbers are also given. We also plan to use a press release service provided by a specialist P.R. company to give even more publicity to the message each ad contains.

Once again, March was a record-breaking month financially, with the highest mail income ever coming into the Radlett office. It was up by 48% over March 1980, giving a present year-to-date figure of +31%.

We respect and love you for such a high calling and for what you are doing to fulfill that great office. Be assured that we, like all the rest, are behind you 100% and feel humbly privileged to be part of that great commission in a little way.

SPECIAL LITERATURE SERVICE FOR PROSPECTIVE MEMBERS

Some ministers have mentioned that they would like for PM's who have requested baptism to receive certain key booklets faster than what third class postage will allow. We are most happy to honor such requests by having their literature sent first class if you will have the PM's note in their letter or card that they are counseling with a minister, and would like to get their material right away. First class will knock off three weeks (approximately) from our normal third class mailing.

An even faster means for prospective members to receive their literature is to have them use our toll-free WATS number (800-423-4444). Ask them to state that they were asked to call by you (the minister) to have their literature sent first class. We will send it the same day we receive the call.

We would like to ask that you exercise caution in how often you recommend the use of first class lit requests so that the privilege is not abused. It should be used only by PM's or for other unique exceptions. Thanks much!
