



YOU MAY BE MISSING OUT on one of the richest blessings on the face of the earth! Ask yourself this question: HOW VITALLY IMPORTANT IS SPOKESMAN CLUB TO ME?

Do you anticipate club night with keen-edged ZEAL and ENTHUSIASM, thinking, "How much can I really GIVE OF MYSELF tonight?" Does your Spokesman Club add SPARK and ZIP to the entire week? Are you truly ENRICHING and ENLIVENING your club--OR ARE YOU ONLY ENDURING IT?

Almighty God's Spokesman Clubs are not the CRUCIALLY IMPORTANT TOOLS in our lives that they ought to be. TEST YOURSELF on the following three points to see how you measure up!

The battle for a winning club is lost before it starts when we are not armed with the weapon of PER-SERVERING PRAYER!

SECOND, do you PREPARE in advance for each club meeting? What happens when you are assigned a speech? Do you wait until the last minute to prepare? Or do you FLOOD your mind throughout the week with poignant thoughts and pungent illustrations to punch, pound, and PILE-DRIVE home your point? Do you bombard your mind with ideas for new business? Do you WATCH world news so you can add life to the Table Topics portion of the meeting? Do you read scintillating books and take part in activities which will make you a colorful person? Do you review the purpose of the club before each meeting to put you in the proper attitude?

Prayer is first, but we must do our part by getting PREPARED!

THIRD, do you PARTICIPATE in every club meeting? Do you consciously set your will to get on your feet at least ONCE at EVERY MEETING?

Speaking ability is developed BY SPEAKING! When you draw back and allow the opportunity to speak pass you by, you miss an opportunity to develop not only your speaking ability, but your whole personality and character! God inspired Paul to write in Heb. 10:38, "... if any man draw back, my soul shall have no pleasure in him." 


## Foul Play
